



ANNEX I Fire Services

I. PURPOSE

The purpose of the Fire Service in East Baton Rouge Parish is to protect life and property and to minimize fire damage caused by, or incidental to, natural or man caused emergencies. The purpose of this annex is to establish fire service policies and procedures for East Baton Rouge Parish.

II. SITUATION AND ASSUMPTIONS

A. Situation

1. Reference Paragraph II. A., Basic Plan.
2. Fire Prevention and control are daily problems faced by fire service personnel. These problems become more significant during emergency situations. Several hazards present difficulties with regard to fire protection including conflagrations, urban fires, nuclear attack, hazardous material incidents, and fixed nuclear facility incidents.

B. Assumptions

1. Reference Paragraph II. B., Basic Plan.
2. Existing fire personnel and equipment will be able to handle most emergency situations within their given jurisdictions. When additional support is required, assistance can be obtained from other departments in the parish via a mutual aid request. Assistance can also be obtained from state and federal agencies.
3. Additional resources can be gained to combat fire related emergencies from Baton Rouge Area Mutual Aid System (BRAMAS). (A list of these resources is maintained by Fire Communications)

III. CONCEPT OF OPERATIONS

A. General

2. The responsibilities of the fire service in disaster situations are basically the same as in daily operations. Their primary responsibility is fire control. They are also involved on a regular basis with rescue operations and hazardous materials incidents. They also serve a supplemental duty of providing back-up support for radiological defense activities.

1. Prevention
 - a. Propose and support fire suppressant laws and regulations.
2. Mitigation
 - a. Fire code enforcement.
 - b. Public fire safety education programs.
3. Preparedness
 - a. Maintenance of equipment.
 - b. Training of personnel.
 - c. Development of communication procedures.
4. Response
 - a. Fire suppression.
 - b. Rescue operations.
 - c. Support in operation of public warning systems (Refer to Annex C, Warning).
 - d. Radiological protection (Refer to Annex F., Radiological Operations).
 - e. Hazardous Materials Incidents (Refer to Annex H, Hazardous Materials).
 - f. First responders in basic life support.
5. Recovery
 - a. Fire inspection.
 - b. Decontamination.
 - c. Continued response operations.
 - d. Assist in damage assessment.

IV. ORGANIZATION AND ASSIGNMENT OF RESPONSIBILITIES

- B. Task Assignments within their jurisdiction:
- ___ 1. The coordination of all fire service activities within their jurisdiction.
 - ___ 2. Fire suppression and protection, including shelters.
 - ___ 3. Fire prevention.
 - ___ 4. Support in operation of public warning systems.
 - ___ 5. Fire code enforcement.
 - ___ 6. Support for radiological defense.
 - ___ 7. Support for Hazardous Materials Incidents.
 - ___ 8. Establishment of mutual aid agreements.
 - ___ 9. Rescuing injured people during emergency operations.
 - ___ 10. Alerting all emergency support services of technological hazards and fire during emergency operations.
- C. Operations
- ___ 1. The Fire Chief of each designated district shall have complete authority for fire operations within his/her respective district.
 - ___ 2. Command Post and staging area procedures will be followed to effectively coordinate all field operations.
 - ___ 3. In declared disasters such as national security threats, man made, or natural disaster, the Mayor-President, through MOHSEP, will coordinate emergency operations within East Baton Rouge Parish from the EOC.
 - ___ 4. Each Fire Department in times of disaster shall designate a chief officer within their respective district with the responsibility of providing situation reporting to the EOC.
 - ___ 5. Each fire station shall become a staging area for equipment and supplies dispatched during emergency rescue operations.

- ___6. Priority of firefighting and rescue operations shall always be given to designated shelters, and areas immediately adjacent to said shelters. (For list of shelters see Annex E, Shelters.)

D. Evacuation

- ___1. Area evacuation in the event of a fire or explosion shall be recommended by the fire chief in charge. Such recommendation shall be coordinated with the law enforcement agency with jurisdiction and MOHSEP.
- ___2. Execution and coordination of an evacuation order will be the responsibility of the Mayor-President and the Director of MOHSEP with the cooperation and assistance of the Fire Department and law enforcement agencies with jurisdiction.
- ___3. An evacuation order may be issued in a situation where in the opinion of the Director of MOHSEP or Mayor-President it is essential to the saving of lives or prevention of serious injury.
- ___4. Prior to the issuing of an evacuation order to the news media for public dissemination, all affected agencies shall be notified and the issuance of such orders shall be announced from the EOC.

E. Support Agencies in Fire Related Emergencies

1. Emergency Medical Services (EMS)
- ___a. Provide medical attention to injured parties including response personnel as needed.
2. Department of Public Works (DPW)
- ___a. Provide heavy equipment such as earth moving equipment as needed.
3. Law Enforcement
- ___a. Provide protection for response personnel as needed.
- ___b. Protect emergency scenes from looting and intruders as needed.
- ___c. Re-route traffic from scenes as needed.

V. DIRECTION AND CONTROL

- A. Reference Paragraph V., Basic Plan.
- B. The Fire Chief with jurisdiction will be responsible for coordinating the response within his/her department.
 - 1. Each Department will develop a Standard Operating Guidelines (SOG) to be followed by its personnel in everyday response. A copy of the SOGs is kept on file at MOHSEP.
- C. In the event of a Declared Emergency by the Mayor-President or the Director of MOHSEP, the Fire Chief or his designee will respond to the EOC to coordinate fire department actions with other city agencies.
- D. If for any reason, the EOC located in the Advanced Traffic Management/Emergency Operations Center (ATM/EOC), 3773 Harding Boulevard, Baton Rouge, LA 70807 is inoperable, the Louisiana State Police Emergency Operations Center located at 7667 Independence Boulevard will be the alternate EOC.
